Berkeley County announces shelter transportation for those on the Cainhoy Peninsula

MONCKS CORNER, S.C.- (Wednesday, September 12) Berkeley County announces transportation options to a shelter, in preparation for Hurricane Florence.

TriCounty Link will have buses pick-up citizens at Cainhoy Elementary, from 2 p.m.- 8 p.m. Wednesday, September 12 and transport them to Berkeley Middle School.

Thanks to the partnership with TriCounty Link, Berkeley County citizens are provided safe transportation options to help them prepare for the storm.

SHELTER INFORMATION: The following Berkeley County shelters are open. Additional shelters may open if needed.

PLEASE NOTE: Those who stay in shelters are responsible for their bedding, food, water, and any other necessities they may have. There is a special needs shelter in Berkeley County. If you require a special needs shelter, please call DHEC at 1-800-578-2031.

- Berkeley Middle School
- Cane Bay High School- This a pet-friendly location. Citizens must stay with their pets during their time at the shelter. Pet owners are NOT allowed to drop-off their pets at the shelters.
- Goose Creek High School- Berkeley County citizens are welcome at this shelter. This is the primary location for Charleston residents.
