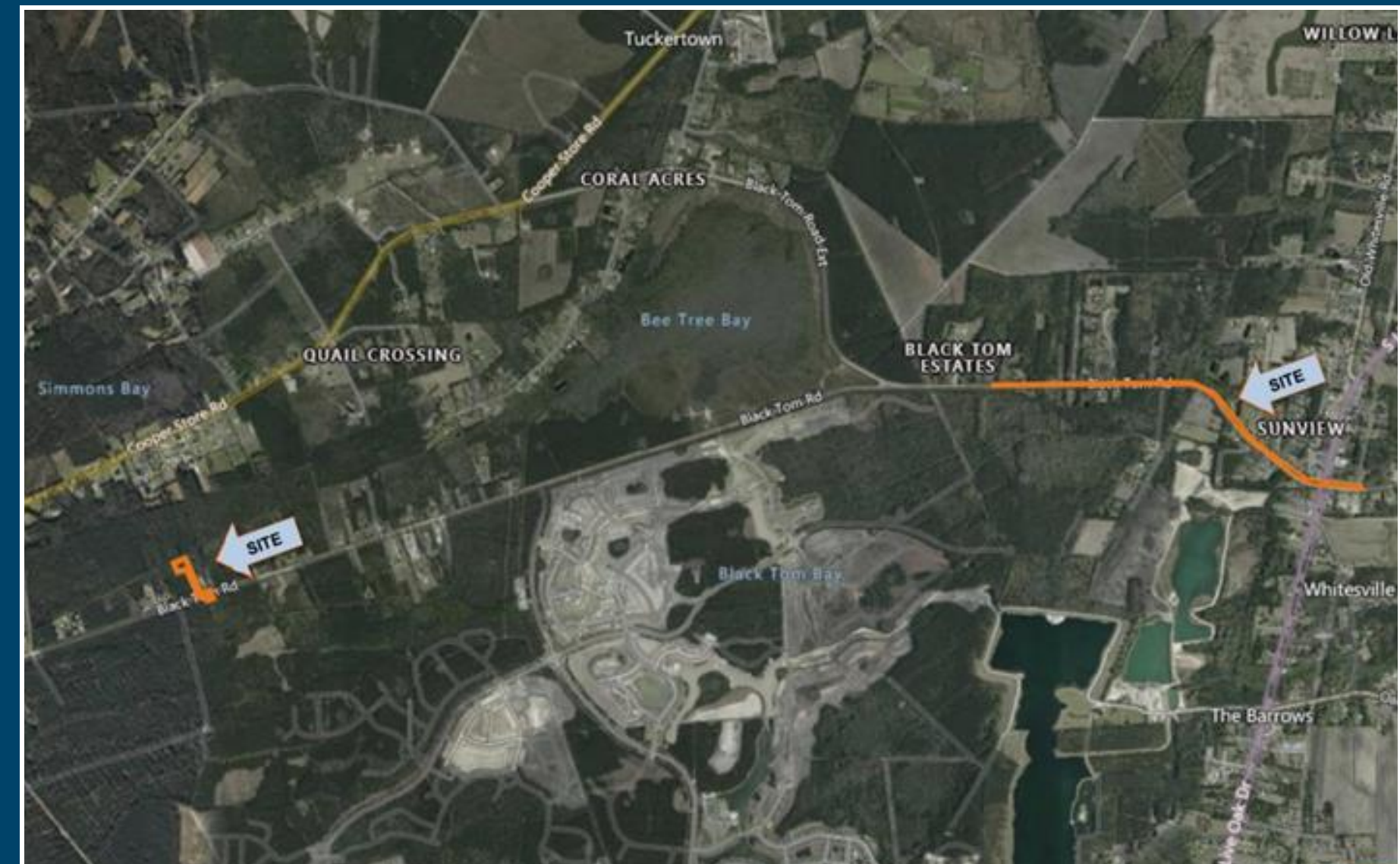

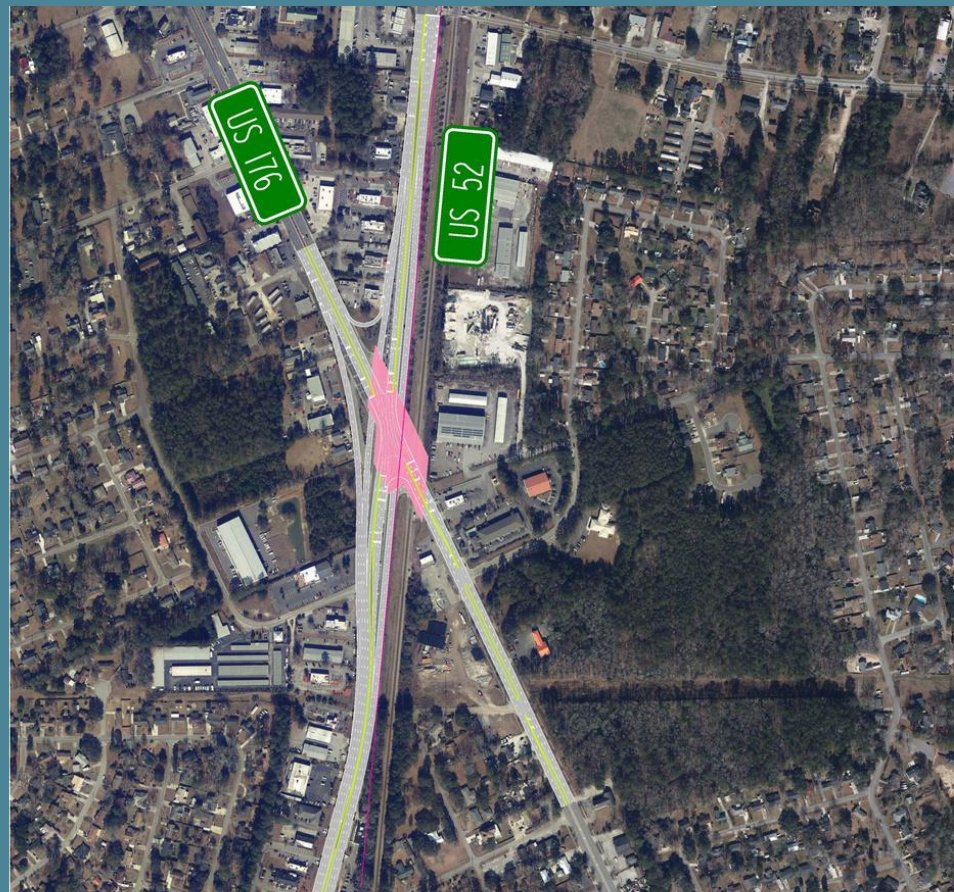
US 176/US 52 INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENT ALTERNATIVES



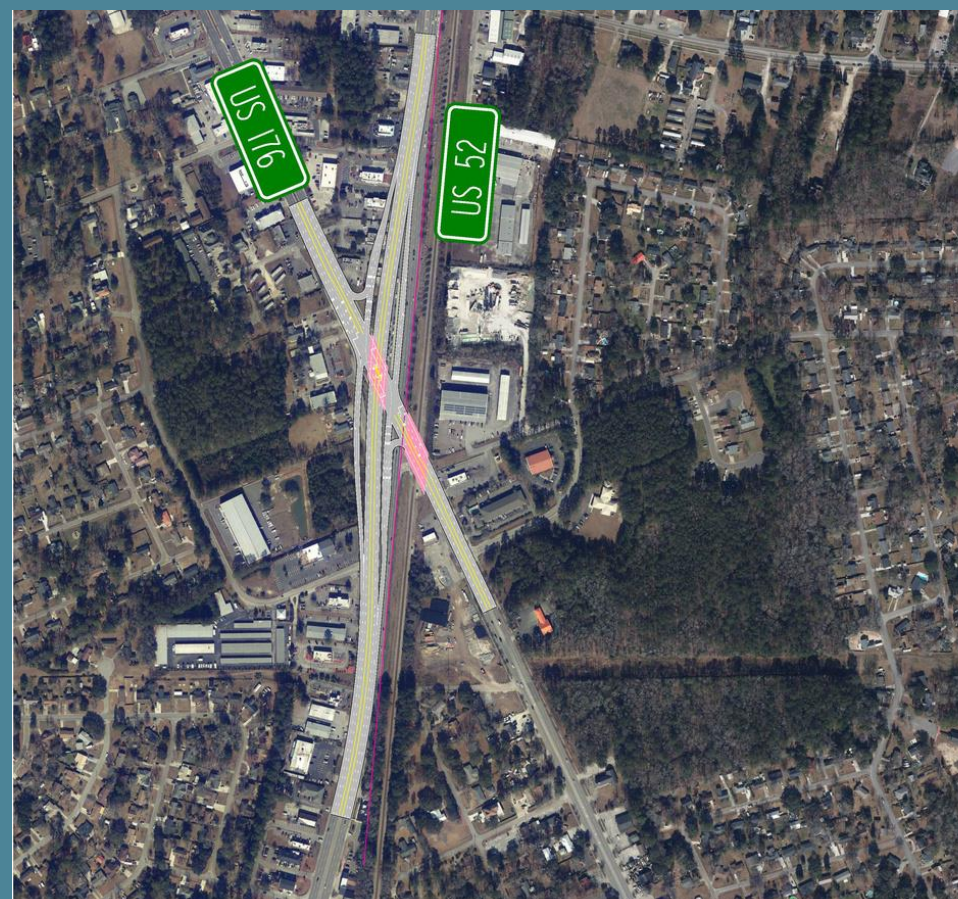
Single-Point Interchange (US 52 above)



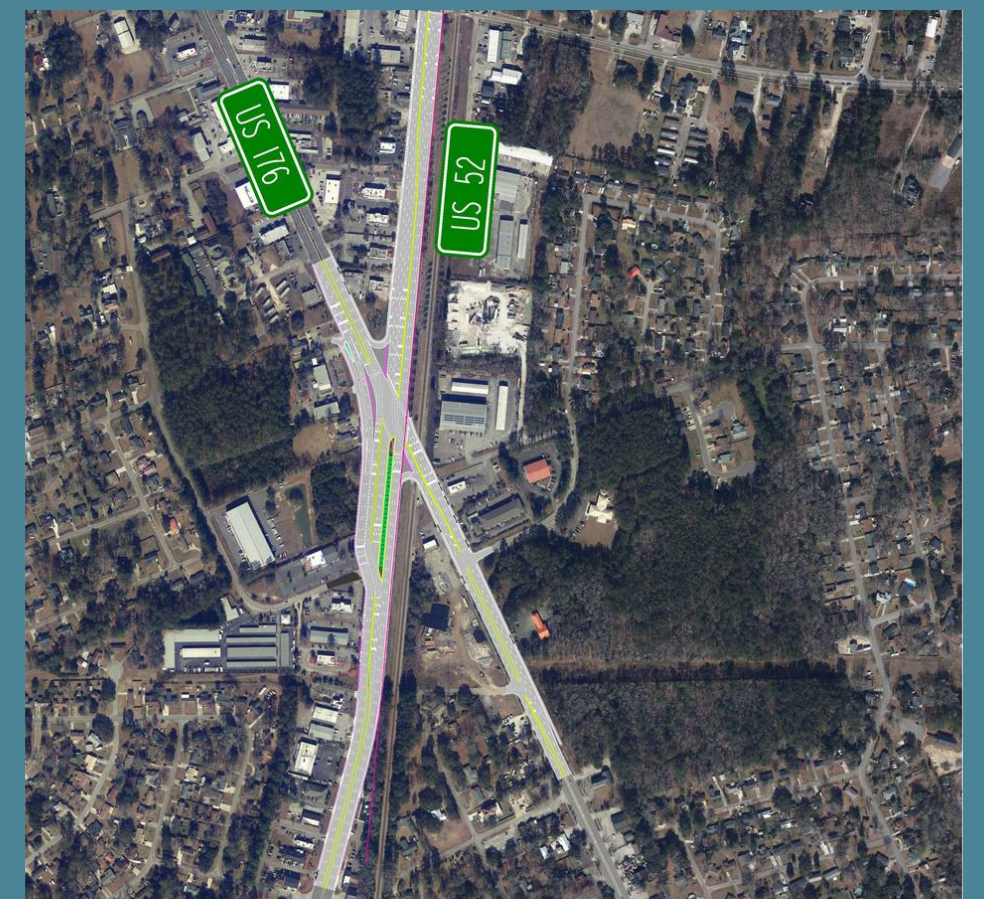
Offset T / Restricted Crossing Intersection



Single-Point Interchange (US 176 Above)

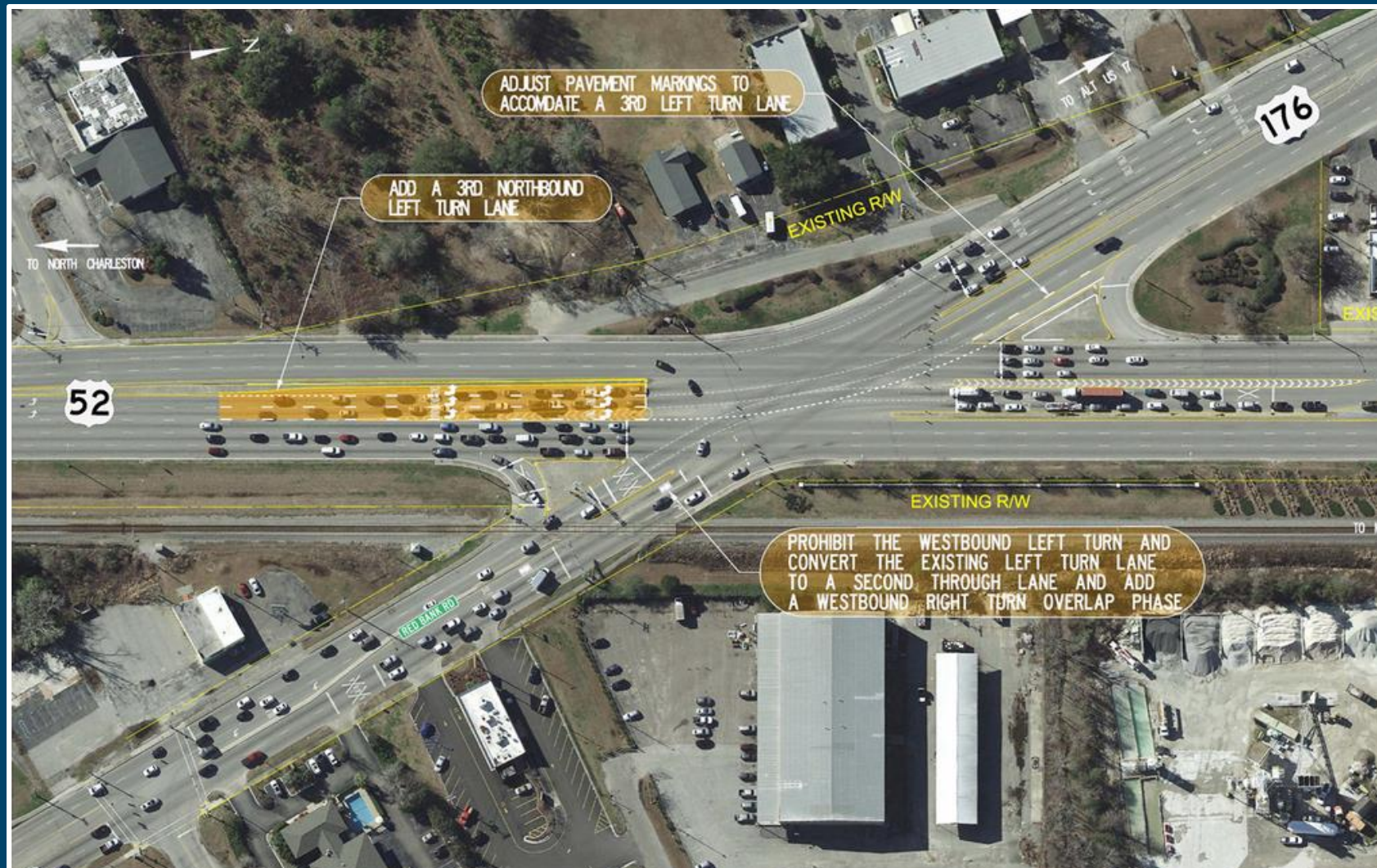


Tight Diamond Interchange (US 76 Above)

US 52 CORRIDOR STUDY

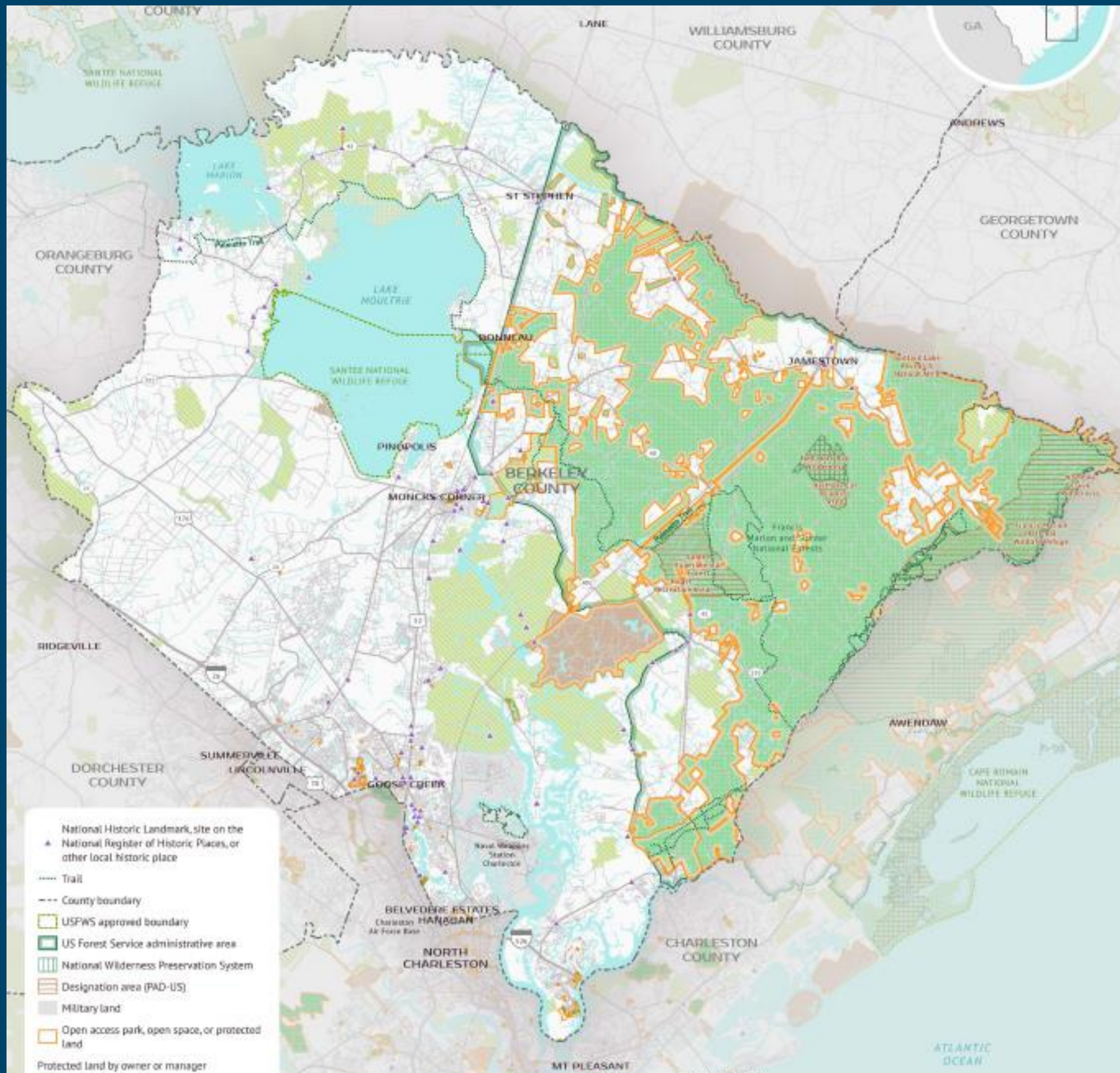

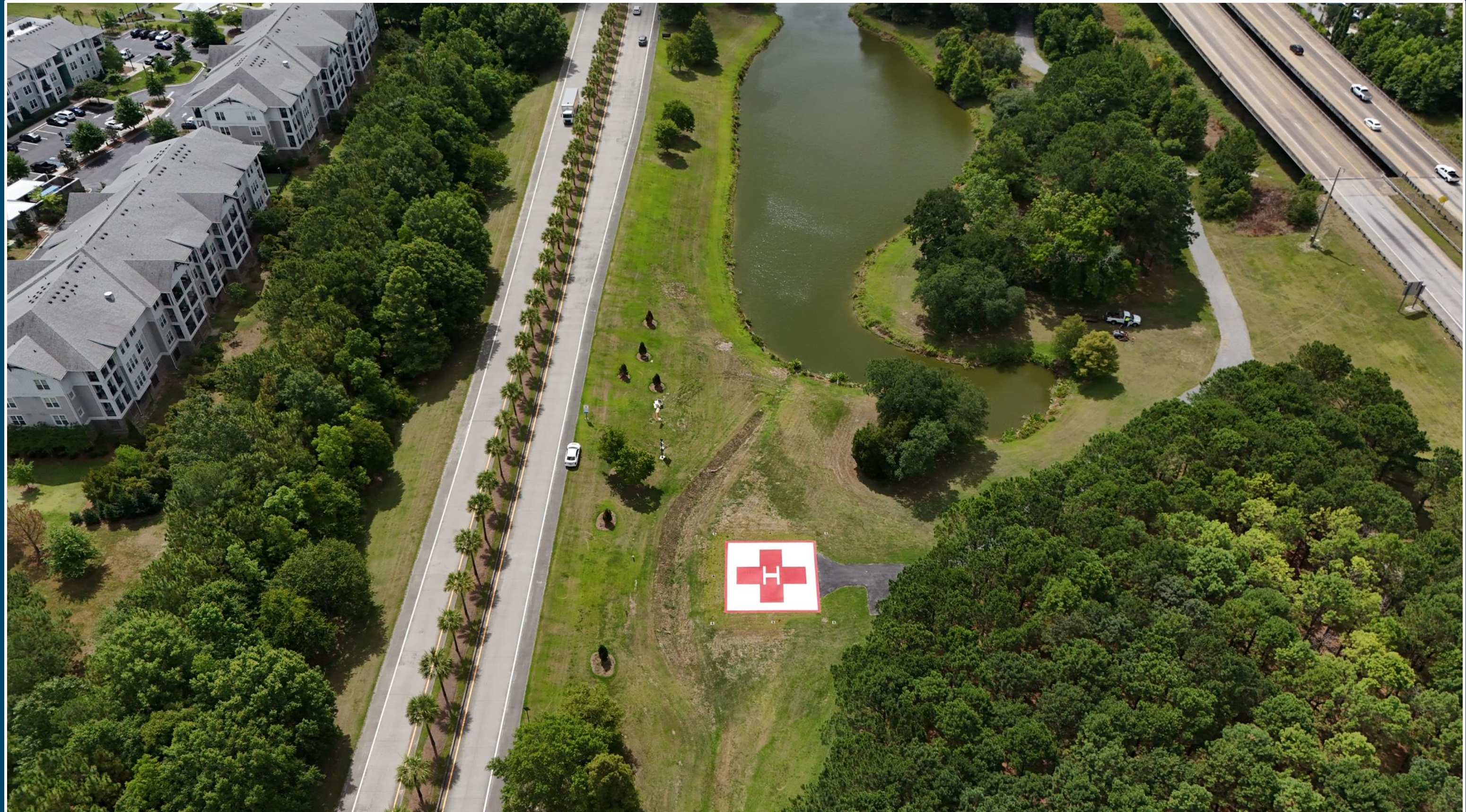

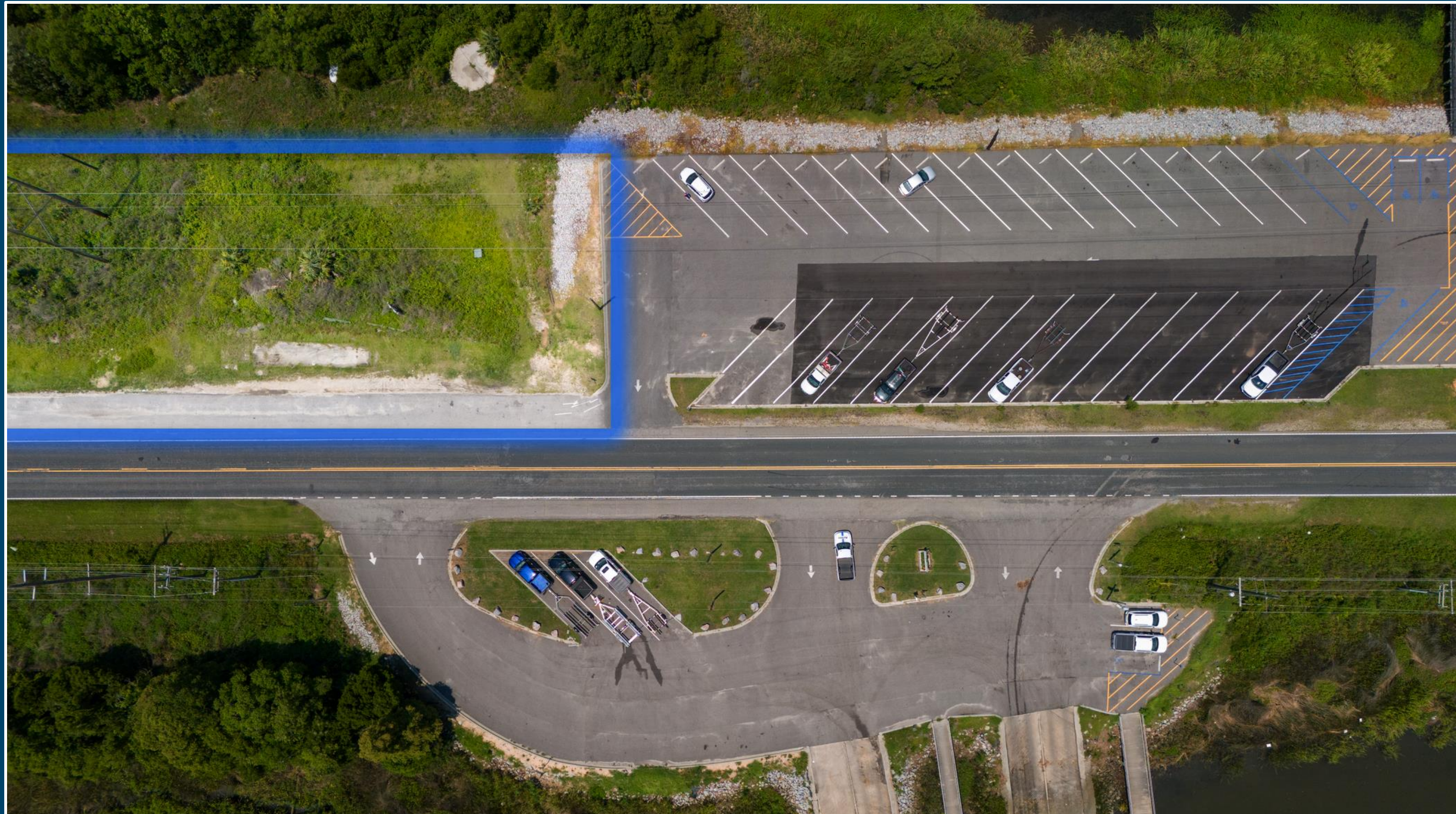
